Dear Friends

Welcome to the 2023 Madrinha Trust Annual Report

We have great cause for celebration this year as we have surpassed the milestone of one hundred alumni – as I write we now have one hundred and two. Enabled by their Madrinha scholarships, mentors and partner charities on the ground, all our graduates have jobs with bright futures. We are grateful for the additional support from our corporate partners who signpost opportunities, hand hold where needed and volunteer to run some of our workshops.

Since 2011, Madrinha has focused solely on providing full scholarships for tertiary education in South Africa, Africa, Nepal, Vietnam, the Caribbean and Palestine.

The wonders of technology enable our Madrinha community to stay in touch via WhatsApp, which has also enabled us to run quick surveys (under two minutes). The surveys really help us to feel the pulse of the trust and help us to make quick adjustments where necessary. There are regular group catchups and group interviews and we also run our entire Career Skills Programme (CSP) on Zoom, which has just completed its third successful year.

It gives me great pleasure and satisfaction to know how close we are to our mentors, our scholars and partners. This synergy makes for excellent results and more importantly the feeling of family this engenders brings joy to all who give their time as volunteers.

I am delighted to confirm that our on-going corporate engagement with Microsoft SA afforded one exceptional graduate, Nomfundo, a

coveted internship (one out of only nine on offer). Both our partner charity MAD Leadership Foundation in SA and Madrinha are very proud of this incredible outcome.

Examples like this show our other scholars that hard work can make your dreams come true regardless of your background.

We look forward to leveraging the power of this wonderful success story to open the doors to more opportunities.

The Teach the Nation SA/KHULA/Madrinha Trust Fellowship Programme (FP) has completed its first two-year cycle and has its first FP cohort alumni fully employed as teachers in the Kwa Zulu Natal region. A great start to their lives as role models to their young pupils. Madrinha's remit is to create future leaders and what better leader than an inspirational teacher.

We hosted a highly thought-provoking Future Think Tank in November, and we are indebted to our guest speakers from Apple, Deloitte and Auzano Capital Management. Part of our remit in 2024 is to signpost more post-grad internship opportunities and keep mentoring until our alumni are gainfully employed.

Another triumphant milestone in the 2023 calendar was our third Madrinha Trust Awards held on 1st July 2022 where we celebrated twenty-one award winners.

This year we will provide on-going sponsorship of fifty-seven students, and we especially welcome our five Vietnamese scholars from Saigon Children, a UK based charity, who we are delighted to be partnering with for the first time this year; welcome all.

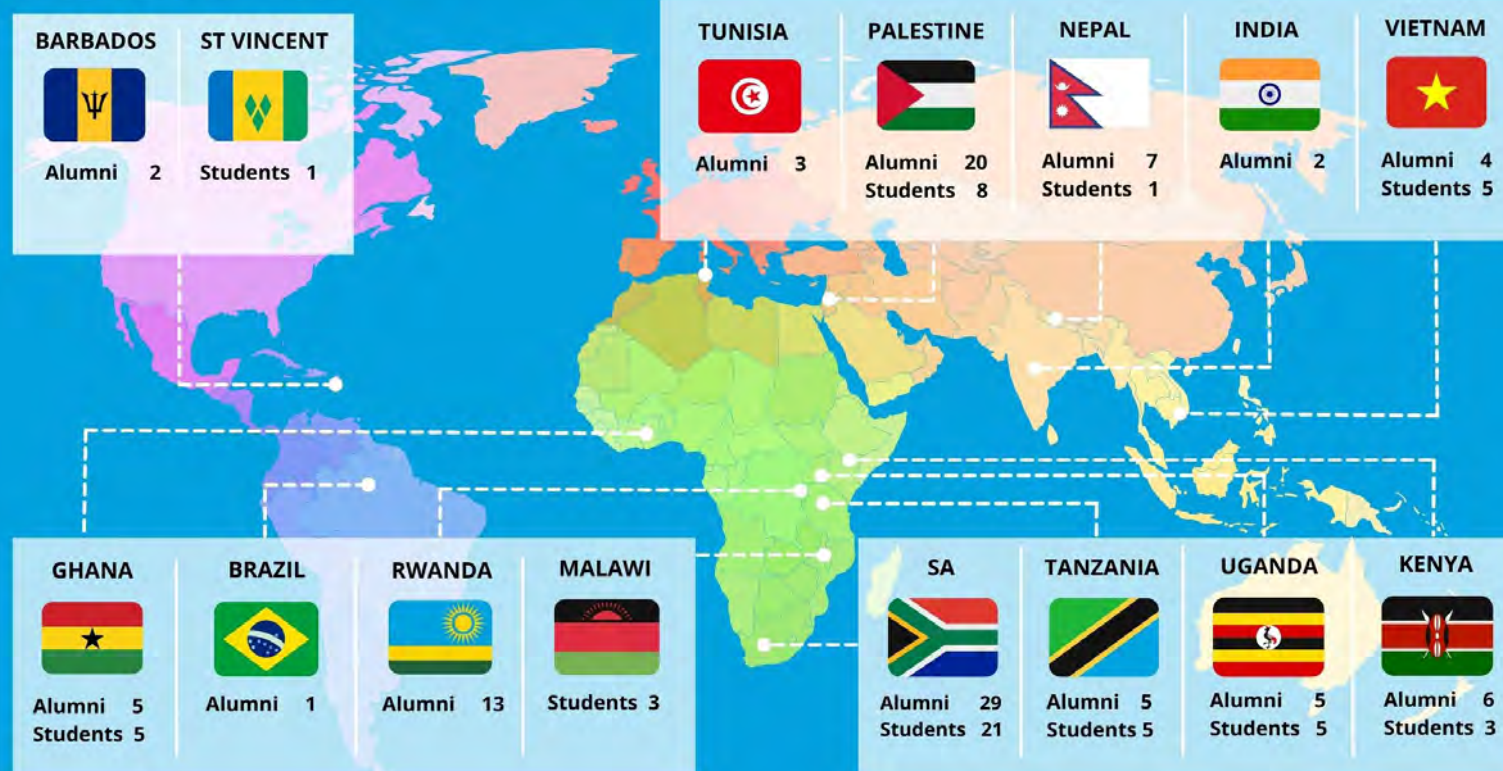

We impress on our scholars the need to have a firm commitment to serve the needs of their local communities and the wider world as soon as they are able. We continue to make this expectation clear, from the start of the mentoring relationship.

SUMMARY OF ACHIEVEMENTS 2023

Currently Madrinha funds **57 scholars** at University, of whom **45% are female** and **55% are male**.

We continue to favour **STEM subjects**, and we also have a strong emphasis on education/teaching and nursing/mid-wifery.

At the end of 2023, we reached **102 Alumni** of whom **60% are female** and **40% are male**, with **100% employment**.

In August 2023, we ran two on-line feedback questionnaires from the scholars' and alumni's perspective – we were very happy with the results.

This year, Madrinha Trust was delighted to engage with a new partner charity in Vietnam, **Saigon Children** with **five scholarships** awarded to two female and three male students.

Every two years, Madrinha holds a **Future Think Tank** session to review the charity's progress and reflect on our journey with input from outside business people. This year, we had the pleasure of guests from **Deloitte**, **Apple** and **Auzano Capital Management**, signposting excellent online career support opportunities and ideas for 2024.

The **2023 Career Skills Programme** organised **11 career and professional development workshops**, five exclusively run by Partner Charities and Corporate partners.

In October 2023, we celebrated KHULA's funding win from the **Coca Cola Foundation SA** for the tertiary education of **10 KHULA**

students over the next four years. KHULA cited the success of the Madrinha model to support their application.

This year our corporate partner **Microsoft SA** ran a hugely inspirational workshop resulting in **seven** of our scholars applying for nine internships in South Africa. We are delighted that **Nomfundo** was successfully selected and started her internship on 1st August 2023.

A meet up with our partner charity Edu Fun and Hannah Reid from Apple UK in Johannesburg was a highlight for the scholars who attended in August.

We also thank Sarah Constantine-Haidry, trustee, for organising a meet up with the **Deputy High Commissioner of Uganda** and a group of our current scholars and alumni.

Our collaborative **Fellowship Programme** with **Teach the Nation SA** and KHULA is now in its second year producing our first Fellows at the end of 2023.

We congratulate our 11 scholars who graduated at the end of this year.

We are very proud of our current cohort of 57 scholars and 102 alumni.

In 2023, Madrinha Trust decided to change the naming of 'mentees' to 'scholars', providing a more impactful statement of achievement on their CVs and LinkedIn profiles.

With a strong group of employed alumni, we were very happy that on completion of a feedback survey in the summer, 50% have all said they would like to mentor in 2024. This will take the form of country and regional alumni buddies as well as the UK mentor support structure already in place.

The scholar feedback survey, also produced excellent positive all round results, with most being very happy with their Madrinha scholarship, mentor programme, Career Skills Programme (CSP) all giving them the best support. The 2023 Career Skills Programme was very well attended and new workshops added in 2024.

The EMC focus has been around supporting internships and adding the wrap-around financial and mentor support needed to enable the scholars to achieve their full potential. All our students graduated well this year and are not worried about their employment prospects.

The continued positive influence of their mentors, CSP workshops and WhatsApp groups enables us to take the view that our collective focus on job readiness is working.

The EMC team has met four times this year and with ten trustees and four mentors, this group is well placed to seed future ideas and support the Trust throughout the year.

We especially thank Andrew Shipley and Vanessa Kyte for co-chairing the EMC.

Teach The Nation SA (TTN SA)/KHULA/Madrinha Trust Fellowship Programme

Madrinha is very proud to be part of this collaborative Fellowship Programme which is just completing its first two-year cycle which started in January 2022.

A mixture of Madrinha graduates, TTN SA graduates and KHULA teachers make up this cohesive group of fellows working out of the 21 KHULA schools in KwaZulu-Natal region in South Africa.

TTN SA bring their excellence and innovation to the KHULA schools and working alongside the KHULA team they bring a refreshing uplift to the existing cohort of teachers and provide new teachers with strong maths and science degrees.

All fellows gain a PGCE teaching certificate, alongside professional development skills. On completion they are taking up teaching posts as well as propelling themselves well into their chosen professional careers.

The ambition is to grow a rotating group of ten Fellows each year, with the elevated levels of maths, science and computer sciences adding huge value to the curriculum and students' career choices.

The Fellowship Programme will continue to be part-funded by Madrinha and is a great post-graduate option for Madrinha scholars.

Appendix 1: Fundraising Activities

The Madrinha Trust's investment objective is to achieve "Real returns on a rolling five-year view with emphasis on income with capital growth". Though interest rates and yields have increased in 2023, most of the past 10 years has been characterised by near-zero interest rates and the income yield of the portfolio has been impacted. The current income yield is c. 1.6%, which is a slight increase from c. 1.4% a year ago.

Following a difficult year in markets in 2022, 2023 has seen positive returns in the portfolio and across asset classes. Inflation has cooled from its multi-decade highs though remains elevated and the year has been dominated by a narrative around the peak of interest rates and inflation. Against this backdrop, The Madrinha Trust portfolio has returned +8.7% in 2023 to the end of November. This compares with a peer group performance (as measured by the ARC Steady Growth Charity Index) of +3.2%. With strong performance from a number of companies in the portfolio we have been actively taking some profits in strong performers and reinvesting and topping up some of the names with attractive valuation upside. This performance is in the context of Global Equities (MSCI AC World Index) returning +10.8% and UK 1-10-year corporate bonds (BofA ICE Sterling Corporates) returning +5.5% over the same period.

Over the long-term, the Madrinha Trust has generated an annualised return of 6.4% p.a. whilst the return objective (UK CPI +3) has returned +5.1% p.a. This compares against 5.3% for the peer group over the same period and is in the context of Global Equities (MSCI AC World Index) annualising at 10.0% and UK 1-10-year corporate bonds (BofA ICE Sterling Corporates) annualising at 3.2%.

Appendix 3: Our Trust Board Committees

Trust Board

The Trust is run by a group of trustees who operate under UK Charities law and the guidelines of the Charities Commission. We hold three trustee meetings each year, attended by all trustees in the presence of a Chair and Treasurer. Each has a structured agenda and in addition to monitoring good governance of the Trust, we share ideas and practices to maintain alignment with our core vision, mission and our values. We live by our ethos.

EXCO

A small number of Trustees are empowered by the Trust Board to meet a further three times per year to enable a faster decision-making process. In addition, the EXCO also reviews in a timely fashion financial details and operational actions. The EXCO reports back to the Trustees three times per year at the Board of Trustees.

Education & Mentoring Committee (E&M)

This has merged with the Career Build Team to form the EMC in 2023. Madrinha merged the E&M with CBT on 9th November 2022.

Education & Mentoring & Career Team (EMC)

To ensure we have an undiluted focus on scholar selection, appointment, monitoring and development, we have established the EMC team which includes two lead trustees chairing each Zoom meet up. EMC meets four times per year and drives all scholar activity and ensures their alignment to our ethos. EMC reports to the Board at Trustee meetings.
